Almost from the beginning, **Jean Fayette O'Neil** has been part of Sigholtz-Capital Chapter 1. Whether as photographer for the Annual Walk to the Wall, Reading of the Names, or other Chapter events, or as a Herd Word editor, revising Chapter by-laws, Jean has been a ubiquitous presence at Chapter events. After a long and debilitating illness, Jean's life of service to others came to an end on May 9, 2015.

Few, among those who thought they knew Jeannie well, were aware that she graduated from Georgetown University in the same class as Former **President Bill Clinton** and former **Chapter 1 President, Terry Modglin**. Jeannie subsequently graduated from Harvard with a Masters in Public Administration. Jeannie worked on the Hill for 14 years for Maryland Congressman, **Clarence Long**, where she was recognized as the "brains" in his office.

Jeannie also played an important national role supporting the National Association. She is one of a handful of women recognized as a Honorary Member. She was a founding member of the 173^d Airborne Brigade Memorial Foundation and played a key role in helping the 173^d Airborne Brigade Association Foundation obtain Combined Federal Campaign designation.

The Chapter was well represented at Jeannie's May 14, 2015, funeral. Joe Flesch, Jeane Flesch, George Farris, Michael Montie, Gene Cartier, Gene Weeks, Nikki Daley, and Mack Brooks were there with Jeannie's many family members and significant other, Terry Modglin. Chapter President, Joe Flesch, presented Terry Modglin with the Chapter Honor set, a folded Brigade flag and the Chapter Certificate recognizing the deceased's contribution to Sky Soldiers. After the initial batch of 25 novelty plate requests are completed, the Chapter President must sign the VR-124 forms. The requester then takes the form to DMV.

A Soldier's Family

It's always a seminal moment when the next of kin receives the American flag that was draped over their loved one's coffin.

It was not at the grave site, but the moment was nonetheless just as poignant, when Mrs. Mary Grace Herbert, wife of former 2/503, 173^d Brigade, Commander, LTC Anthony B. Herbert, received the Honor Set from Chapter 1 President, Joe Flesch.

LTC Herbert died of cancer on 7 June 2014, at the age of 84, and was buried at Arlington National Cemetery 9 February 2015. A number of Chapter 1 and other Sky Soldiers were present at his burial.

At the request of the family, a

When all was ready, Joe said a few kind words and gave the Honor Set to the weeping widow. Mrs. Herbert expressed her appreciation and everyone was moved.

Afterwards, everyone posed for pictures. There were smiles all around as we departed, each gratified that they had served another Sky Soldier's family well.

My First Herd Reunion

May 2 – May 6, 2015 proved to be a exciting and interesting week for me.

I attended my first 173d Airborne Brigade Association Reunion. I served in the 173^d Airborne in Vietnam from January 1968 through August 1969, in Company A (Admin) Support Battalion. I handled Second Battalion's personnel. I made many friends, three of whom I maintained a close relationship after returning to the States. Two of these friends, **Nelson Keyes** and **William Simms**, joined me in San Diego to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the 173^d Airborne Brigade entering Vietnam.

My mission, when I arrived, was to let **Roy Scott**, know that I had brought the Brigade colors to be used at the reunion, from Maryland. That accomplished, Nelson and I began to circulate and meet as many Vietnam Veterans as possible. These paratroopers were unique. Many were part of the original troops deployed from Okinawa, on May 5, 1965. Brigade flags, shirts, jackets and hats were everywhere.

I represented our **Chapter President, Joseph Flesch**, at the National Officers Board meeting and General Membership meeting. The formal banquet blew me away. I had not expected to see former Soldiers in full uniform, carrying out duties, as if they were still on active duty. I met four other Chapter One members, **Curtis Tucker**, **James Cherry**, **James Smith**, and **Bradley Gant**.

This was my first Herd Reunion. God willing, it won't be my last.

Reading of the Names 2015

There were fewer walking the familiar route to the 173^d Airborne Brigade Marker this year. Notable absentees were MG **Lee Surut, Mike Belenky,** and **Jean O'Neil**; nevertheless, the Band of Brothers trudged resolutely forward to perform their duty to ensure our fallen comrades not be forgotten.

The road barriers, limiting vehicle traffic by the Marker, the speaker podium, and the neat row of chairs were testimony to Ed Anthony's consummate planning. Even the bugler was ready and waiting. The Vietnam veterans were pleased to see three new faces waiting at the National Cemetery Admin Building. The first, Bill McQuail, a Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) veteran who had two deployments with 1st and 2nd of the 503rd Infantry, 173^d ABCT. The second was Bill's father, former paratrooper, LTC (Ret.) William H. McQuail. The third was Bill's friend, Matt Van Scoik. The old troopers greeted these unfamiliar fellows with a level of enthusiasm only a paratrooper could appreciate.

Chapter President, **Joe Flesch's**, Pledge of Allegiance and brief remarks were followed by a prayer by **Mack Brooks** and Taps. Afterwards, one-by-one, those present read the names of Sky Soldiers killed in Vietnam, in 1969, and all the Sky Soldiers lost during GWOT. As always, those who gave some were particularly moved when they read the names of someone they knew who gave all. Appropriately, **LTC (Ret.) McQuail**, **Bill McQuail**, and **Matt Van Scoik** read the names of the GWOT losses.

Seemingly, sooner than expected, the last name was read. Everyone posed for pictures, content that each had fulfilled his duty to those with whom we served.
