Troopers, both young and old, gathered in Alexandra, Virginia, for the annual Brigade reunion held May 23 through May 27. We visited the Vietnam Memorial to pay solemn tribute to the 1,647 Sky Soldiers killed in combat in Vietnam. During more than six years of continuous combat in Vietnam, the Brigade was the most decorated unit of any size, earning 14 campaign streamers and 4 unit citations. Sky Soldiers were awarded 13 Medals of Honor, 46 Distinguished Service Crosses, 1,736 Silver Stars, and over 6,000 Purple Hearts.

A half century ago the 173rd Airborne Brigade was recovering from a staggering year of combat in the central highlands and the coastal low lands of Vietnam. The old Sky Soldiers at this reunion who survived those days remembered their brothers who did not live to see this day. Their names are now forever

enshrined on the Vietnam Memorial just across the Potomac. I speak of those lost souls because their memory was so near to us at this reunion. It was as if their ghosts were present and asking if they could join us and catch up on all they had missed in the last fifty years.

Today some of us walk with limps, we walk with canes and walkers--those of us who can still walk. Still breathing, but no longer the

Frank Mantua Receives Silver Star By Dave Curtin

On May 25, 2018, in Las Cruces, New Mexico, former 1LT Fank Mantu was awarded the Silver Star by Congressman Steve Pearce at the Las Cruces Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

On this Memorial Day, I will highlight what Frank himself said at the ceremony as captured in the article. In typical Frank fashion, he chose to remember our dead from the 4 March battle rather than dwell on himself.

From the Article:

"Mantua, of Company D, 16th Armor, 173rd Airborne Brigade, served as a platoon leader during the battle of Tuy Hoa and received his honors at the Vietnam War Memorial.

On March 4, 1968, he helped the Company defeat two enemy battalions in an all-day affair that saved several key American and South Vietnamese installations from being overrun. He was wounded but led his platoon in three separate assaults and provided cover fire. Mantua also led a few volunteers in a daring attack with small arms and hand grenades.

He continued to lead his platoon until the

company commander ordered him to evacuate because of his wounds.

On Friday, Mantua, accompanied by family, accepted his medals and thanked members of his platoon who lost their lives in combat.

"I wouldn't be standing here if it wasn't for them," he said. "They sleep forever young, but they do not dream. So it is up to us, in our lifetimes, to memorialize them by living out their dreams, to be the best sons and brothers we can be, to be the best husbands and fathers you can be, and best citizens you can possibly be. This is what we owe them."


