Vietnam Veterans Memorial Information



The 2018 Reunion of the 173^d Airborne Brigade will include a visit to The Vietnam Veterans Memorial. “The Wall” is one of the most visited attractions in Washington, D.C. For 35 years, The Wall has stood as a somber and moving tribute to the over 58,320 men and women killed or missing during the war.

As the years move us further and further away from the realities of the war and those who served, we must find ways to keep alive the memories of the individuals who sacrificed for all for us. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund has embarked on a heroic mission to do just that.

Since 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF) has pursued a mission of preserving the legacy of The Wall, promoting healing, and educating about the impact of the Vietnam War. To further this mission and to help personalize and memorialize everyone, the VVMF is collecting funds to build an Education Center to tell the stories of our fallen heroes and provide an educational experience about the Vietnam War.

The VVMF is also looking for photos to help bring the story of those listed on the Wall to life. Official military photos, yearbook photos, family photos, and personal remembrances are welcome.

The images will become part of the "Wall of Faces" - a lasting tribute for the Vietnam Memorial Education Center. You can help. If you have a picture of a loved one or fellow veteran whose name is on The Wall, please help the Memorial Fund honor these individuals by putting a face with a name. Regardless of whether the Memorial Fund has a photo of the individual already or not, we encourage you to submit it anyway.
